Most of all may it keep each of you and all of you together with Pastor Steve reaching towards God and stretching to know Him more and be more for Him.

ANNUAL CONFERENCE

It will be a joy to be back in person for Annual Conference!

This year's Annual Conference will be held June 9-11 at Hofstra University on Long Island. NUMC will be represented by Pastor Lori and new Lay Member to Annual Conference, Justin Birtwell. (Pastor Lori will return home Sat night.)

Because Conference has been reduced from four days to three as a cost-cutting measure, there will be some changes to the schedule. However, the main components will be present. Conference will open Friday with the Memorial Service at which all clergy, spouses and children who have died in the past 3 years will be remembered. There will be briefer, worship services throughout and Conference will end with what is arguably the highlight: the service of Ordination on Sunday morning. It is always so inspiring to sing and worship with hundreds of other people!

Of course business must be conducted as well. Legislative sections allow reports, petitions and budgets to be dealt with more expediently. However, the overall Conference budget will be discussed and voted on in the plenary on Saturday - this budget becomes the basis for each local church's apportionment. In the Corporate session we will also hear from the Conference Board of Trustees and approve any church starts, mergers and/or closings. It is anticipated in this season that we will also need to vote on church disaffiliations - at this writing, there were just several churches in this annual conference who are choosing to disaffiliate.

Part of the joy of annual conference is meeting up with old friends and colleagues, and making new friends. Fellowship is huge - whether it's sharing a meal, early morning communion, or running into people in the dorm or hotel.

The United Methodist Church is based in connectionalism - we are stronger together than alone - and our annual conference is a lived example. For sure, disagreements are to be expected and sometimes tempers flare, but God willing, we remain united as brothers and sisters committed to Christ and to doing His work in the world.

Please keep Pastor Lori and Justin in prayer, and all the clergy and laity who attend.
