FROM YOUR PASTOR

Grace and peace to each of you.

I hope that the spring is unfolding in good ways for you - it has certainly been a green one!

As I shared in worship last month, effective July 1, I am being appointed to the Katonah-Purdys UMC in Katonah, New York. The Katonah and Purdys UMCs maintain separate property (Purdys actually rents their building to the YMCA of Northern Westchester during the week) while worshiping and ministering as one congregation. John and I will live in the parsonage in Katonah.

I anticipate that my last Sunday will be June 18. I believe it is important to have a "buffer" Sunday in between pastors. On Sunday, June 25, the Rev Dr Brian Bodt will lead worship and preach. Brian comes with extensive training and experience in transitions, and you will want to hear what he has to say!

I anticipate moving the week of June 19 in order to allow our Trustees time to ready the parsonage for Pastor Steve and his family - because of course he needs to allow time for the Plainville trustees to do the same.

I am getting to know Steve and think you will find him an extremely solid and able leader - a man of great caring and integrity - with a great bass voice! There will be more from and about him in the June Evangel.

When a pastor initiates a move, there is always the tendency to ask, Why?



Since I have had the Why question posed to me numerous times over the last few months, I want to offer this explanation:

John and I had first considered fully retiring this summer, but with the clergy shortage in our annual conference that did not seem right. However, it did feel like a good time to make a change from NUMC for both personal and church reasons. The personal reason was that John and I wished to be closer to NYC. He still works in Manhattan part time and has physicians at both Hospital for Special Surgery and Memorial Sloan Kettering.

But more importantly, it felt as though *from the perspective of ministry and this church's future,* it was also a good time for a change. After 7 years, I know this church well and love it dearly, but a new pastor brings a new pair of eyes - new insight and new energy. Safely through the pandemic (we trust) and ready to restart ministries and launch new ones, perhaps in conjunction with the Western Frontier Parish, it felt to me as though new insight and new gifts were a blessing.

We will have another 2 months together, but please know now how much I have appreciated doing ministry with you - what you have taught me and given me. And John and I will never forget your kindness and support after Greg's death.

I will continue to keep you and Pastor Steve in my prayers long after I have departed. I know with all of you working together with the Holy Spirit, NUMC's future is bright.


