Here it is time once again for . . . "Thanksgiving." I remember Thanksgivings of yore, or at least my youth when the family would gather 'round the table laden with turkey, stuffing, peas, creamed onions (yum!), mashed potatoes, gravy, olives, and pickled black walnuts (blech!), finishing such with pumpkin and apple pies. Aside from the grace that was said beforehand, very little if any mention of being

thankful was made. It made me wonder about the day's real meaning. Oh, I knew it had something to do with Pilgrims and the native peoples of this land, but what had it to do with me? Since then I've learned an awful lot about Thanksgiving, both the good, the bad and the ugly. Regardless, I still think the possibilities this holiday holds are valid and unfulfilled. The children in elementary school are still told the stories of starving Pilgrims and generous Native Americans, but, again, little about giving thanks. What can we do that will do this time justice?

The answer may lie in that the unique opportunity the day presents. Thanksgiving may just provide the perfect excuse to count our manifold blessings. We take so much for granted: The air we breathe, the food we eat, the teachers who teach our children, our jobs, the church, our salvation, our family, our community, etc. The list for each of us would almost seem inexhaustible if we were to break it down.

Make this Thanksgiving truly meaningful by taking time to take a "blessings inventory". In between the turkey and pie, before some depart for the walk to "walk off what they've eaten" (which given the amount eaten might indicate a multiple-mile-walk) have everyone around the table write down three things that are blessings in their lives. Keep them anonymous if you want, and then have one member of the family read them aloud, concluding with a simple prayer of thanksgiving to God for those written and the unwritten blessings. The potential for enriching Thanksgiving is enormous. "Give thanks, with a grateful heart!"


A NOTE FROM YOUR NOMINATING COMMITTEE
