PASTOR'S CORNER

"O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever!" Psalms 118:1



Yes, give thanks to the Lord! Let us do just that. It does us good. I have a great deal to be thankful for. I have a wonderful family, a beautiful wife and two very different, very brotherly sons, and an incredibly funny, sweet and intelligent daughter, who's become quite the young lady. We are fortunate to live in this beautiful town and parsonage in Sandy Hook where I am fortunate to serve a wonderfully energetic, outgoing, and outstanding church! Most of my assorted weird plants are still alive, some even thriving! Most importantly I give my God thanks for what Jesus Christ, God's Son, has made possible for me and all of us – reconciliation to the Lord our God through his sacrifice upon the cross. Yes, there have been some times and occurrences in life that sought to squelch any voice of thanksgiving. And it's a struggle at times not to let those things silence the thanksgiving I feel in my heart towards God.

There are moments, hours, days even when we get so caught up in a particular moment that the forest gets lost to the seeming importance of a certain tree before us, and our perspective becomes skewed. There is a way, I believe, that we can manage our perspective and always give thanks. The answer comes in the way the Psalmist tells us he looks. He doesn't mention the forest or the trees, but rather in Psalm 121 he talks about hills. We don't know what the Psalmist was going through at the time he wrote those words, but it must have been one of those days — a day where things happen that can rob the heart of thankfulness. But rather than get stuck in that muck and mire, he pens these words, "I lift my eyes to the hills — from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth." Ps. 121:1

He lifts his eyes beyond the situation to God and regardless of the reality he will have to endure; it is not the end. God, the God who made those very hills, will lend him comfort and strength to get through it. "He will not let your foot be moved; ... The Lord is your keeper, ... he will keep your life." The Psalmist is still able to see that through it all, God is with him and will keep him whole and in God's care. Even through all the "stuff" he was going through he can still find a tongue to praise and thank the God who loves him.

School is starting up again, and all the anxiety, studying and work that goes along with that. Outside of school, in our own lives we hear about what is going on in the world: natural disasters, nuclear threats, divisiveness, economic issues, etc. And then bringing it home, we can add to that our own personal griefs, sorrow and pain, past and present; certainly, there are any number of things that can stop us from fully offering thanks. But, thanks be to God that we can say, "Thank you", even through all we endure that might keep us down, that might silence our voice of thanksgiving. We may not be delivered out of all that stuff, but the God who loves us and cares for us will give us the strength, peace and comfort to get through whatever threatens to overshadow us. Trust that God will give you these things as we, by faith, lift our eyes to the hills and see the mighty gentle hand of God at work in our lives. Remembering, as the Psalmist did, "He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep... The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore."

Choir rehearsals will resume on Thursday, September 7 from 7-8:30pm in the choir room.






