I am also here to celebrate with you - to lift up those times of great joy and blessedness. This church, to the best of my knowledge at the moment, is one of successful ministries that touch the hearts and lives of people well beyond its own walls. Sunday, September 3, we will once again be up on the parsonage lawn at 9am.


As always, please make sure to bring a lawn chair and wear comfortable clothing!
