Valentine's Day is this month. So is the beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday.

It just so happens they fall on the same day! Interesting. I'm spending part of my Valentine's Day/Ash Wednesday in our church's parking lot in the morning from 7 – 8:30 am, offering ashes to anyone who might want them as they drive through. "Why?" you ask. To reach out. To provide a way and means that can lead to repentance, to salvation to a re-connection to the Lord God who created and loves us, and desires that we strive to live more in the way God's One and only Son, Jesus, did. I'm hoping to accomplish at least six things with this:

- 1) I'm hoping to be a divinely-led, human contact for whoever drives through our lot
- 2) I hope to perhaps be the one place those desiring ashes for the beginning of Lent can get them
- 3) To give opportunity for people to perform an act of penance by donating to the Food Pantry
- 4) To be a witness of the value of repentance and regaining a life lived for and with the Lord
- 5) To put a face and name to the relevance and presence of our church located in Sandy Hook, Newtown
- 6) To represent and put the good name of our church, the Newtown UMC out there

I hope this inspires some of you to get out there and represent and witness to the love of God embodied in Jesus Christ with our words and deeds. I'm not saying to get out your supply of ashes and begin imposing them upon people! (*I don't think you would, but I want to be clear.*) We are called to be "evangels" – messengers of God. How is God at work in your life? Figure that out. Condense it into a thirty-second or so story and you've got a powerful witness that is personal, real and authentic that could have a marvelous impact on others.

Perhaps this could be the thing you give up for Lent – your comfort to do what God wants us to do – spread the Good News! Maybe I'll see you Valentine's Day/Ash Wednesday! Maybe you'll be the reason this Lent that someone else discovers, rediscovers a vital relationship with the Lord? May God bless you as you do.

"When We Are Living" is a Spanish hymn by Robert Escamilla, including both English & Spanish texts in our hymnal (No 356).

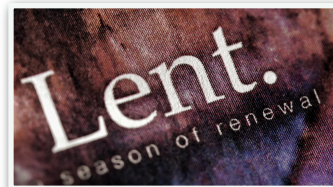

The pastor holds the following office hours:

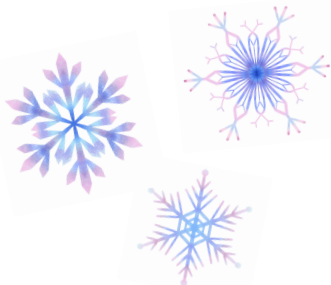

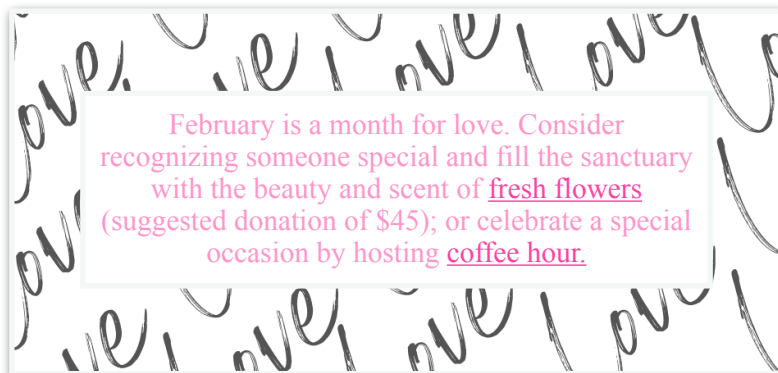

Hello Church,



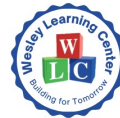
