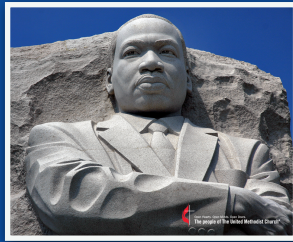

January is a quiet month at Wesley Learning Center. The excitement of the holidays are over and it's back to business as usual.

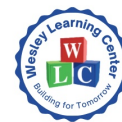
