




HOLY WEEK


GOOD FRIDAY March 29, beginning at 7:00pm

7:00am - A simple service in the memorial garden, celebrating as the women who approached Christ's tomb as the sun rose and found the tomb empty! The service should last about half an hour, so bring chairs if you feel the need.

9:30am - A service including the Easter story, beautiful music, flowers and a special children's conversation. Come and celebrate with us and with grand joy as we sing and praise our Risen Lord and Savior!
